August Trip Update

The August trip was a huge success thanks to a committed group of volunteers and a lot of local support in Austin as we organized and prepared for the trip. While the front end organization went smoothly, we found the economic downturn has taken a huge toll on the families in the colonia. The needs far outweighed the available resources. The stories they shared of desperation, hunger and thirst were devastating.

- Rising unemployment creating a very real hunger crisis. These families already live a hand to mouth existence. There is no financial buffer. There is no welfare. There is no unemployment check. NO JOB MEANS NO FOOD!
- The mother of a small baby pleading for infant formula because she was unable to produce enough breast milk to feed her baby.
- A family of six had not eaten in two days before we arrived.
- Lack of available water/water pressure due to funneling water to more affluent areas.

We currently budget to deliver groceries [rice, beans, flour, oil, and soap] to 750 families at an approximate cost of \$6.50 per family. The cash donations are dwindling with the economy and we need your help to continue to fund the grocery dispensa every other month.
