#### **President's Report**

# Our bi-monthly mission trips have resumed! Praise God!

The service delivery model has evolved to include more local support as well as ensure the safety of our volunteers.

- Grocery orders are now placed with the neighborhood grocery store through Alejandro, a resident of the colonia. Alejandro is the inventory control manager and coordinates the order, purchase and loading of groceries for each trip. Other local volunteers and Father Tony now provide assistance in transporting groceries to the church for distribution.
- Men and ladies of the colonia then help bag the groceries and prepare the site for the various activities planned for the trip including distribution of baby items, school supplies, hygiene items, religious items, as well as sponsorship items.
- One of the key modifications to our mission trip protocol is that all materials are purchased locally. No cargo is transported by mission volunteers across the border. As a result, we can no longer accept donations of cargo. Your cash donations are greatly needed and appreciated.
- MTM now has a volunteer on the Mexico side of the border who helps with purchase, storage and delivery of special needs like school uniforms, shoes, coats, school supplies, blankets, soccer balls, etc. Claudia Valdez has been instrumental in our ability to continue our delivery of services under this new model.
- With the local support of up to 30 men and 10 women and teens, we can now manage with a minimum of 15 to 20 missionaries per trip. However, the three day August trip (August 1,2,3) will require at least 20 missionaries to handle the school supply and sponsorship distribution. Please consider joining us.

We thank the Lord for his continued guidance in providing for the needs of our brothers and sisters in the colonia and for the generosity of our volunteers and their willingness to serve! We also thank the many supporters of our program. Without your prayers, personal support and cash donations, the work we do would not be possible.

- Affix mission signs to all vehicles before crossing border.
- Arrive Colonia around 1:00 pm and set up site for sponsorship distribution.
- Depart Colonia around 4:30 pm for hotel via the Columbia Bridge.

- Depart hotel by 8:00 am for Columbia Bridge.
- Affix mission signs to all vehicles
- Arrive Colonia around 9:00 am

# Treasurer's Report By Pat Gavia

First, let me thank those supporters who have stuck with us and continued to donate during this time of restructuring. We greatly appreciate your support. As you can see from Rachel's article, we have designed a new system and are back in the business of making bi-monthly mission trips.

The estimated cost of a bi-monthly trip (including groceries for 550 families, cost of workers, supplies, and our local storage) is estimated at \$4,600. We have August, October and December trips still to come for this calendar year, resulting in \$13,800 that is still needed just for mission trips.

This amount does NOT include funds needed for our Sponsorship and School Supplies programs. These are accounted for separately. Sponsorships have currently been paid through October, 2013.

This fiscal year, we have received \$4,241 in *general donations* from March 1st (the beginning of our fiscal year) through June 30th, including two rather large donations of \$1,500 and \$500. For this same period last year, we had received \$21,569 in donations.

As you can see, we have a significant budget shortfall and will need to drastically increase our donations to continue to fund our bi-monthly trips. Every donation, no matter the amount, is appreciated.

Please prayerfully consider donating to Mission to Mexico so that we are able to continue helping our brothers and sisters in Nuevo Laredo.

# **Sponsorship Report**

June in the sponsorship world means that we travel to the colonia, gather grades, and measure the kids for their uniform shirts and shoes. With the expert help of several mothers of sponsored kids and two of our college graduate sponsorship alums, we were able to measure 145 children in the few hours we were at the colonia. Although we tried to get the word out to the sponsorship community that we were going to be back to our "normal" schedule in June, it is apparent that many of the families either did not know we were there or were unable to attend. Hopefully they will be present in August so that we can get them ready for the upcoming school year.

It was very exciting that the children remembered, in large part, to bring their grades so that we are able to chart their progress in school. In fact, two young men and one young woman arrived with their certificates showing they had completed their high school studies! That means that we will have six sponsored college students for the 2013-2014 school year!! How wonderful is that?!

August will find us scurrying about distributing the uniforms and new backpacks filled with school supplies to the children. Our college students will receive the cash equivalent to apply to their college tuition. We will also throw a "graduation party" for our recent high school and college graduates and their parents. August also means it is time to distribute scholarship applications to our university students so that they can return them for evaluation by a scholarship committee in time for scholarships to be awarded in October.

None of this would have happened or will happen without the continuing dedication and support of our resolute sponsors. Thanks to each and every one of you. Your generosity and unwavering faith in our mission to educate the children of the colonia is yielding amazing results!

A short personal aside. God truly blessed me when I was finally able to return to Nuevo Laredo in June. While I knew in my heart that it was the right thing for me to do, that conviction was driven home each time I was greeted by the children and their parents. The joy and gratitude I personally experienced during our short time in the colonia reinforced for me the importance of our mission not only to those we try to serve, but as importantly, to the volunteers who participate. As it is said, it is in giving that we receive. My cup runneth over!
